Shriram EPC bags 156-crore order

CHENNAI: Shriram EPC along with its subsidiaries has bagged orders worth Rs 156 crore. The deals include a Rs 90-crore contract (won by its subsidiary Hamon Shriram Cottrell) from Mangalore Refinery and Petrochemicals for setting up a cooling tower and cooling water treatment plant for phase-III of the refinery project, a Rs 30-crore order from Kerala Feeds for setting up of a 300-tpd cattle feed plant at Kallelibhagom, Karunagappally, and a Rs 36-crore order from the Kerala Water Authority for a clear water pipeline at Kochi.
